Purpose of Post

artsdepot is looking for a heritage specialist with experience in curation and project management to collaborate on an exciting volunteer led exhibition project celebrating artsdepot's 20th anniversary. Working closely with a Volunteer Manager and team of local volunteers, this role will involve supporting and guiding the research into artsdepot's history and its context leading to an exhibition across the venue in 2025.

Project

This project is a volunteer-led deep dive research project exploring artsdepot's history from the idea of a new arts venue for Barnet being floated at a conference in 1996 up to our twentieth anniversary in 2024. The research will also explore the social, political and cultural context of our stories, and the many communities who have been a part of that journey. The stories will be curated into an engaging and interactive exhibition running across our venue. The exhibition will run for 8-9 months over which time we anticipate 100,000 visitors. As we celebrate 20 years of operations we want to reflect on the milestone of 3,000,000 visits to artsdepot, and make the case for capital investment as we begin to look towards the next 20 years ahead. After the exhibition is complete we will capture and mould the content into an engaging timeline and heritage section on our website.

We are looking to capture idea to institution, the history of artsdepot, its culture, people, their stories, and the context as well as launch a volunteering programme we can embed into our ongoing activity.

• Devise and deliver the volunteers training programme in collaboration with the Volunteers Manager. This programme may include aspects curation, heritage interpretation, storytelling and curation, access and inclusion and digital skills amongst other areas of focus.

- Direct and support the research process to gather and collect stories and artefacts including identifying gaps in lines of enquiry and facilitating further research opportunities for volunteers.
- Working closely with volunteers to support how their research translates into exhibition outcomes. This may include engaging other multi art form specialists and practitioners to work with participants.
- Co-curate the exhibition leading on ensuring a clear through line from participant led research to the final exhibition considering best practice to ensure accessible and engaging physical and digital outcomes.
- Work closely with the Director of Programming and Participation and Volunteer Manager to ensure all project outcomes are met.
